IMPORTANT NOTICES:

Membership Fee now \$30-00 per year. This increase was approved at the 2008 AGM. We regret the increase but after 14 years we have no alternative due to increased costs in running the Association.

Future Changes to Newsletter Distribution:

As the result of rising costs of paper and postage, the distribution of the ATHSOS Newsletters in the future will have to change. Traditionally, the March Newsletter has been posted to all traced Old Scholars listed on the database, both members and non-members alike. This has now become a very costly and time-consuming exercise with approximately 4,000 Newsletters to be printed and distributed at a cost of around \$3,500. After every mail-out we receive dozens of Newsletters marked "Return to Sender". In the future the "RTS's" will be tagged untraced and will not be tracked down. PLEASE put the Old Scholars Assoc. on your change of address list when you move house and in the case of a death, ensure that a relative or friend notify the Member Secretary. Also, sadly, there are many Old Scholars receiving the Newsletter who do not have any interest in the Association and therefore those Newsletters and postage costs are a loss to the Association.

The Committee has therefore decided that in future, the Newsletter will only be sent to Financial Members AND those Old Scholars who request it.

This can be done by returning the enclosed Membership and/or Details form enclosed.
No Membership or Details Form received, no more Newsletters.

Members will continue to receive the Newsletter by post, unless they nominate to receive it electronically when they next renew their subscriptions. (Members will be notified by E-mail when they are posted on the Website.) Apologies if you have been receiving a printed copy instead of electronically. We are still perfecting the system, which has been made difficult by not having a permanent Membership Secretary. A similar service can be provided for non-members who submit a formal request to the Membership Secretary with their contact details.

Old Scholars can re-connect with the Association via the website or a Committee Member.

USE IT OR LOSE IT: Unfortunately the Website is not receiving many "hits", which is a pity as Peter Keen has put a lot of time and effort into its initial set-up and continues to keep it up to date. Mr. Cannell burst in, demanding to know what the commotion was about. Little Jimmy Potter, breaking the pregnant silence with an enormous understatement, said,

NO, not John, Paul, George and Ringo, but Kath, Judy, Lesley and Chas.

In my memory of the Adelaide Tech. Old Scholars Association there have been four constants. These four folk have guided, pushed, cajoled and yes, even conned your Committee and Association towards the success it now enjoys and have done so for more years than even **they** would like to recall.

Kath Harrison (West) 1939 & 1940

Kath was a member of your committee for 9½ years, serving as Treasurer (6 years), Vice President (2 years) and Committee Member, retiring in mid-2007. I recall Kath also acting as Minute secretary at times. Kath guided many new Committee Members in the path of service to your Association. Her fantastic memory of "things past", the discussions and decisions arrived at made serving with her a pleasure. My heartfelt thanks for her assistance and humour while breaking in us newcomers and keeping us on the straight and narrow when we wandered off track. Characters like Kath Harrison come along only rarely in one's life and I feel blessed by her presence in mine.

Judy McKeough (Downie) 1958 – 1961

Without this lady we would not have the quality archives we now enjoy. Judy and husband Bill have devoted a large part of their lives to the Association since 1997. Judy has turned part of her home over to the archives and those of us who have had the pleasure of serving on the Committee are constantly amazed at her energy and organising ability. The members who attended the Memorabilia Display in Brookman Hall in 2008 saw just how much Judy has done to bring the archives into order and those of us on the Committee now realise (if we didn't before) how much time and effort Judy has given to the Association. Judy has served (on and off) as our very capable and efficient Secretary for 7 years and our Archivist for the past 6 years. Judy's transition from typewriter to computer 3 years ago has been quite challenging for her, but she has mastered technology with her usual efficiency. Lesley Moir (Averay) 1962 – 1964

Ross Taylor 1954 – 1956

GRACE DOBLE MEMORIAL SERVICE

Grace attended Adelaide Technical High School from 1954 to 1957. She was a brilliant student who, tragically, was diagnosed with leukaemia in her Leaving year.

Her twin brothers, Chris and Bill, were only four years old when she passed away on 9th April 1957. They decided to hold a Memorial Service on 19th April 2007 to mark 50 years since she died. This service was advertised with the hope that some of her friends and fellow students would attend, and perhaps bring memorabilia, including letters and photos, as her brothers had very few memories of their sister. Two friends from primary school and four from Adelaide Tech attended the service in the Florey Chapel at Centennial Park, along with Doble family relatives. The service was conducted by a celebrant and included a eulogy of Grace's short life read by her brother, Chris. Lynette Winckel (nee Bissland), a close friend of Grace's at ATHS, read a letter from Grace, written in 1957, just weeks prior to her death. It was a typical teenage letter, full of joy and hope, and how she was passing the time reading many books. She actually had no idea how sick she was. Photos and other memorabilia were displayed and stories shared. After morning tea, the family led the way to Grace's grave where each person placed a single flower as a tribute.

As a result of this service, ATHS friendships have been renewed. Some of Grace's former classmates are now meeting on a regular basis and enjoying one another's company, with the usual reminiscing of the wonderful days at the Tech.
